



Information for foreign institutions











APPROACH

The Department of Economic Development and Infrastructures of the Basque Government, with the aim of finding operative solutions for emerging new realities and future challenges, both for European and global spheres, launched the programme "Global Training" in 2012. This programme promotes transnational mobility among young Basque graduates to carry out activities and projects related to their academic and professional profile at companies/organizations in foreign countries, with a previously planned training programme, during 6 months.

AIM OF THE PROGRAMME

- To promote internationalization among young Basque graduates by carrying out international internships directly linked to a professional activity.
- To promote **economic and social cohesion through cooperation** between different agents and the generation of **mutual benefit** both for the young graduate and the host institution.
- To reinforce the role of **practical international learning** as a generator of citizenship, knowledge, intercultural dialogue and an opening towards other peoples and cultures.

PARTICIPANTS REQUIREMENTS

The applicants for a Global Training grant must meet the following requirements:

- Must hold a high level academic Degree (University Bachelors, Masters or PhD degree, vocational Training cycle)
- B2 English level (C1 English level for English speaking countries)
- Maximum age: 30

SELECTION CRITERIA OF PARTICIPANTS

- Suitable profile for the practical training to be carried out at the host institution
- Specific training in the field of the activity that host institution carries out
- Motivational factors in relation to the programme and activities offered within the programme

PHASES OF PARTICIPANTS SELECTION

The process to select participants is followed according to the type of each internship grant offered and will be carried out in the following phases:

- Preselection with CV and language test to each applicant (June-July)
- Personal interview (September)
- Final Selection within the committee of the consortium (September October)
- 2 weeks of compulsory theoretical training at Mondragon University (October)
- Starting date at the hosting institution, as soon as the theoretical training is over (before the end of the year)



PHASES FOR HOSTING INSTITUTIONS

The process to select hosting institutions is as follows (dates subject to change, depending on the speed of Government's procedure):

- Sending internship request + extension letter of intent (March-April)
- Mondragon University applies for a number of grants following Basque Government call (April-May)
- Basque Government approves our application (May)
- Mondragon University launches the programme in order to recruit interested graduates (June)
- Call for applications opens for interested graduates (June-July)
- Selection procedure for participants (July-September)
- Communication of selection to hosting institutions (September October)
- Starting date at the hosting institution, before the end of the year



WHAT DOES THE GRANT AND PROGRAMME COVER FOR THE GRANTEE?

- Monthly basis grant: 1,500€ funded by the Department of Development of Economy and Infrastructures.
- Travel, health, accident and liability insurance policy offered by Mondragon University
- Registration in the national social security service

*The grantee will face accommodation, travel, visa (if any), etc. costs

WHAT DOES THE HOSTING INSTITUTION COMMIT TO?

- Tutoring the grantee during 6 months training
- Signing a three party agreement provided by Mondragon University
- Completing an intermediate and final report provided by Mondragon University
